

Readme file for reproduction of Tables in the paper ‘Nudging at scale: evidence from a government text messaging campaign during school shutdowns in Punjab, Pakistan’

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Overview

This is the readme file for the reproduction of tables and datapoints in the paper reporting on the SMS GIRL Impact Evaluation. All the data is available as Stata-data files, and the analysis is run in Stata-do files. There is a master-do file that sets paths and relevant definitions and runs all the code from the underlying do-files that produce the tables. Data were collected by the World Bank in collaboration with the Government of Punjab. Data were accessed in October, 2025.

The code provided reproduces:

- All numbers provided in text in the paper
- All tables in the paper except for Tables 1-3 which describe the school closure periods, intervention, and provide an overview of the data collected by survey round
- Note that there are no figures in the paper.

Requirements

The analysis is run in Stata 18 MP on Microsoft Windows.

Instructions for Replicators

- Update the following files with your directory paths
 - replication_file_00_master_sms_girl.do
- Ensure all required software and dependencies are installed as listed in the Requirements section.
- Run the master do-file.

The replicator will need the following non-standard modules for the analysis:

- ietoolkit (for balance tables)
- outreg2 (for outputting the tables in publication format)
